

Organic Adventure Trail



This trail is approximately $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles long, and may take between half an hour and an hour to complete, depending on walking speed.

Exit the Farm Shop and turn left onto the road. After approx. 100m, keep going straight past the left hand turn. Continue along the road, past Vallenders on the left (Private), until you see a gate on the RHS - opposite the bungalow. Go through this gate, onto the track. Continue along the track and under the railway line and then turn left. Keep going along the surfaced track and then continue up the hill on the grass track. At the top of the hill, there is a kissing gate (KG) on the RHS. Continue through this and head across Hill 60 to another KG at the bottom of the field. Continue on the marked footpath initially alongside the wood. At the top of the slight hill, turn right and continue through a KG and into Field 3. Follow the RH edge of the field until you reach the KG at the bottom. Continue on the track until you meet the road. Turn right onto the road, take care as you pass over the bridge and carry on until you see the Farm Shop on the LHS.

Adventure Trail - alternative routes

The alternative routes marked on the map enable the trail to be shortened if desired, or allow much, if not all of the walk to be completed on well surfaced tracks.

River Wey Trail

This trail is approximately 1 mile long and may take between half an hour and an hour to complete depending on walking speed.

Exit the Farm shop and turn right onto the road. Continue along the lane past New Hop field and Blisters on the LHS and the Big Water Meadow on the RHS. Continue until you cross the River Wey over the little bridge. Carry on up the hill, then just before the crest of the hill turn right onto the footpath. Continue along the footpath, heading diagonally across the arable field and then onto a grass tack leading to Isington Lane. Turn right, crossing back over the river and climbing the hill. Field Marshall Montgomery lived in the Mill House on the LHS here. At the top of the hill, turn Right at the T junction and return along Isington Road to the Farm Shop.

To see along the way...

There is always lots to see along the way. Keep an eye out for our herd of South Devon beef cattle, our flocks of Black Welsh Mountain and Wiltshire Horn / Easycare sheep and our herd of rare breed pigs. You will also pass through fields containing a variety of different crops - grass, clover, herbs, organic cereals... There is also an abundance of wildlife that inhabits the farm, see what you can spot....

Please follow the Countryside Code and along any road sections observe the Highway Code
